I would suggest 1 writing activity, 1 maths activity and 1 other activity 1 day. Also, if your child could practise some reading to help develop fluency, that would be great.

3. Maths

- **Story of 17-** Use lollipop sticks to discover the sums that make 17. Start off with 2 numbers, then 3 numbers. Write the sums in your copy.
- Counting and the 100 square. Start at 2 and count in 2's. These are the even numbers. Start at 1 and could in 2's. These are the odd numbers.
- Start at 5 and count in 5's e.g. 5, 10, 15, 20, 25, 30 etc. Colour these numbers on the 100 square (attached).
- Continue playing clap and tap. Child throws the little cube to land on the 100 square. They clap the number of tens and taps the units. Record this number on the blank abacus (attached).
- Money- making up amounts. <u>Challenge</u> your child to think of all the different ways we could pay for an item. <u>Begin</u> with a small amount e.g. 10c and <u>gradually</u> increase the amount to 12c, 15c, 20c (some children will find this more challenging). Be guided by your child. <u>Record</u> answers in copy e.g. 5c+5c 2c+2c+2c+2c etc
- <u>Change-</u> we <u>count on</u> from the small number e.g. I had 10c. I bought a lollipop for 5c. What change will I get back? Child counts six, seven, eight, nine, ten (put one finger up for each number). My change is 5c.

In Topsy Turvy Land.




Extra 'optional' fun activities
