Sally go round the sun,

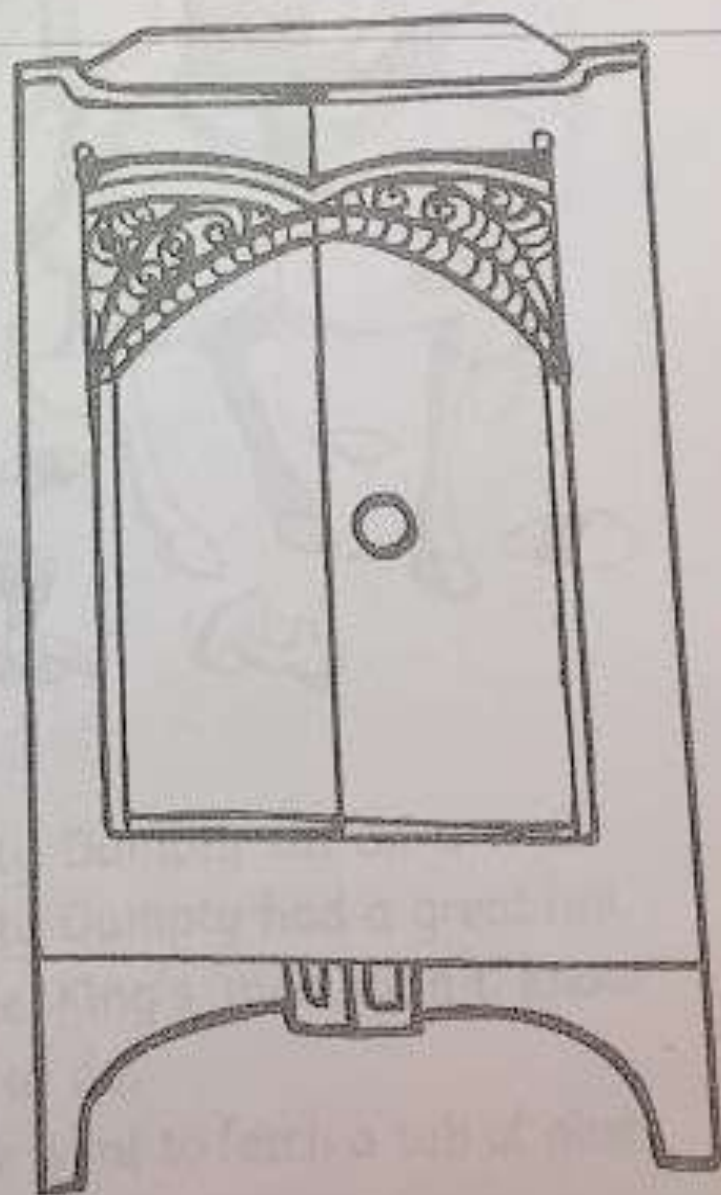
Sally go round the moon,

So one went to fetch a tub of glue.



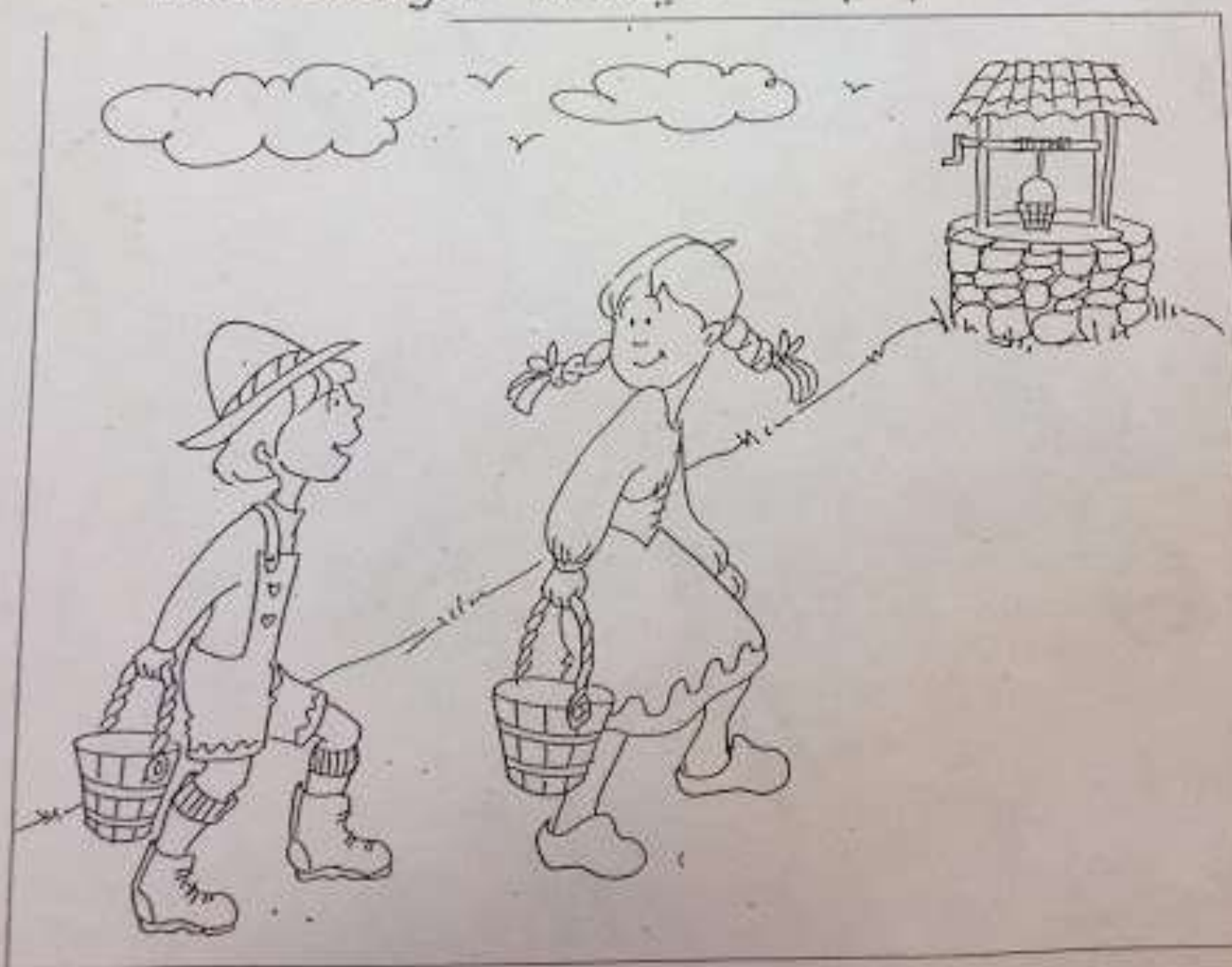

Jack and Jill

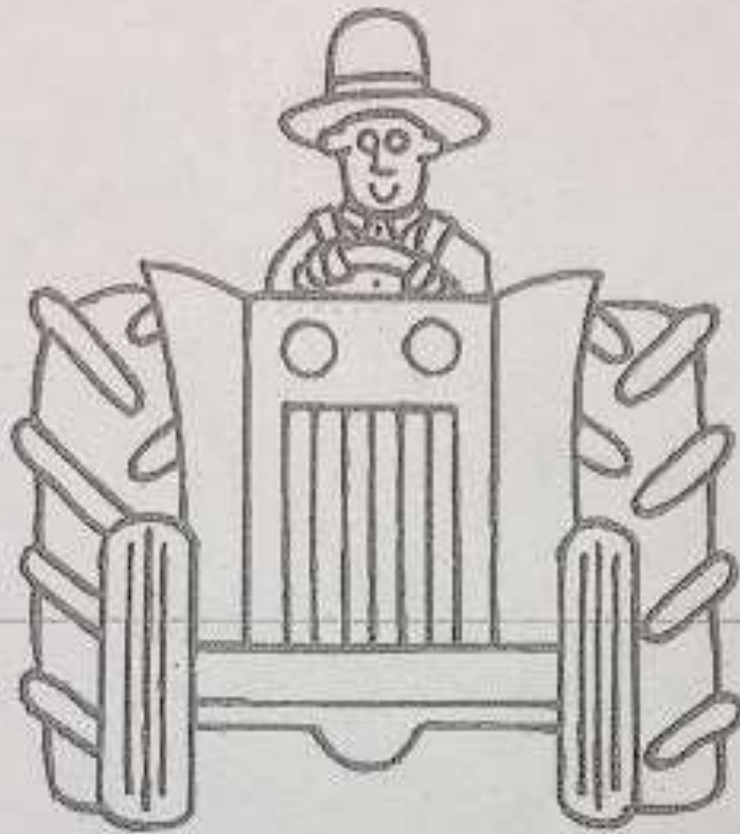


Jack and Jill went up the hill

The Farmer in the Dell



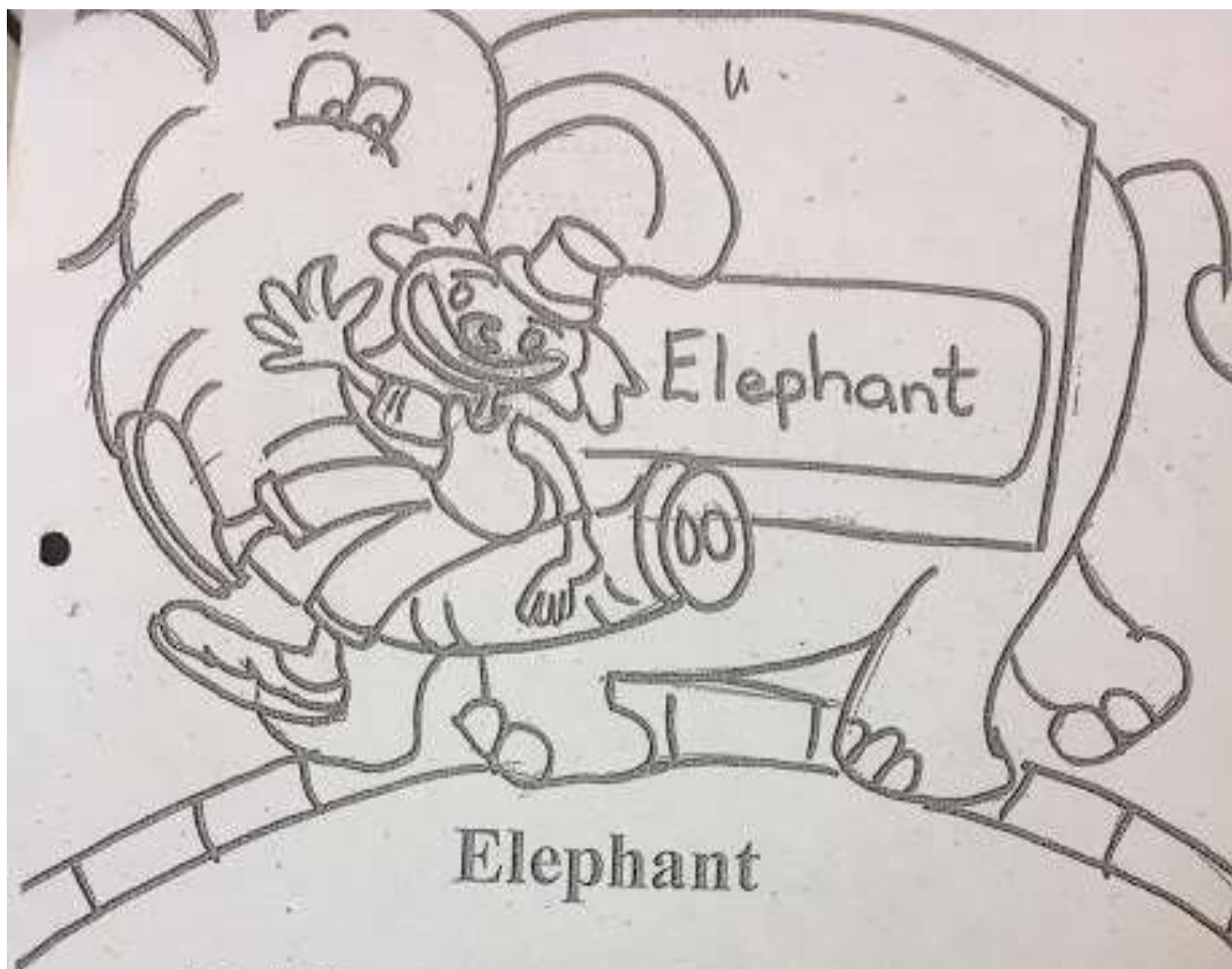

Pizza on my hair.


Pizza on my fingers,

Pizza everywhere!




Elephant

With my trunk and four big feet.




I fell out of bed

To market, to market.

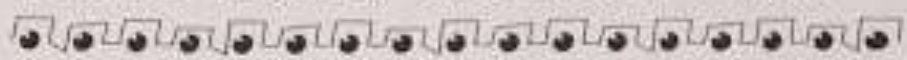


To market, to market,

There was a Crooked Man



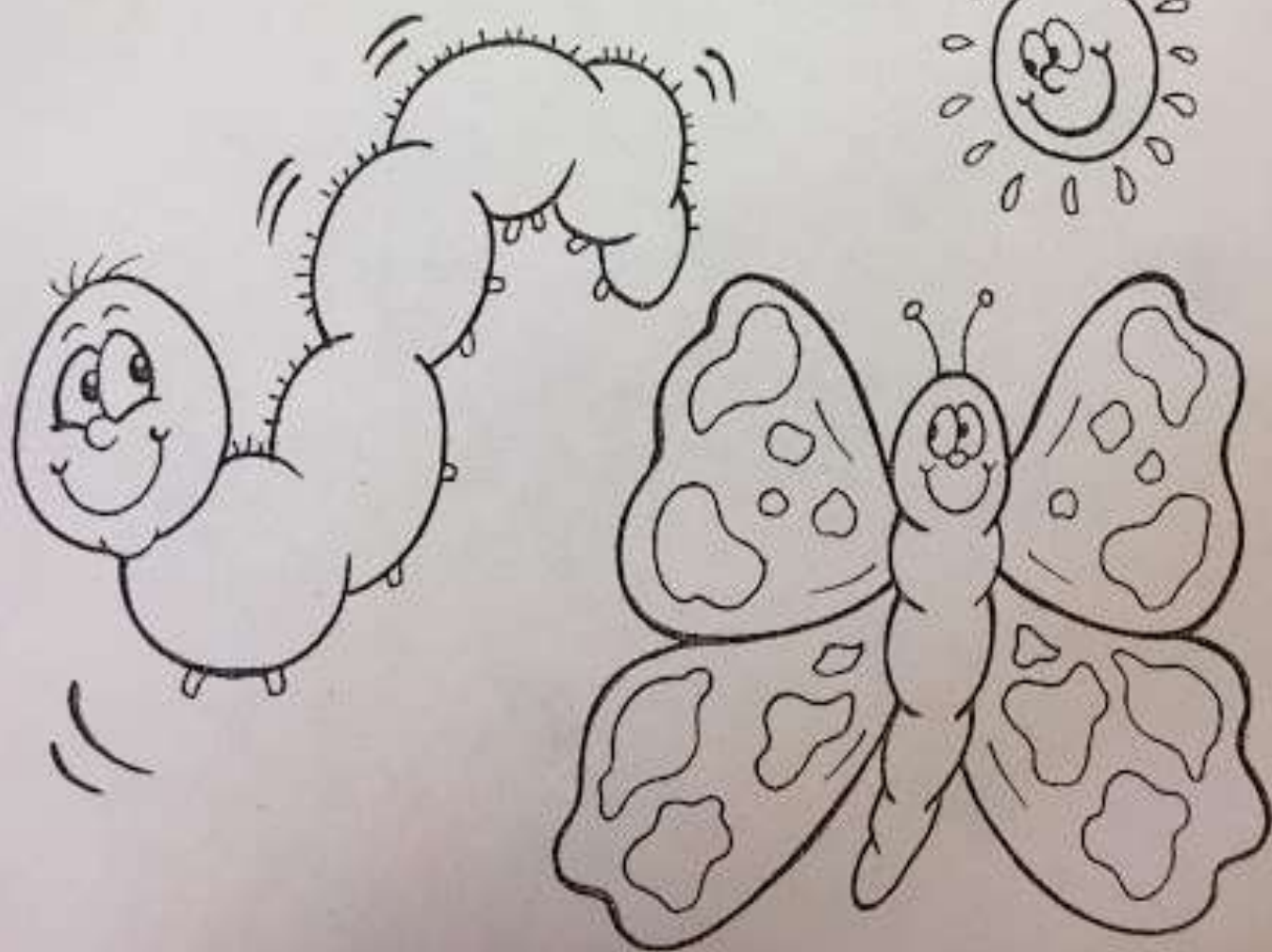
There was a crooked man,

Wiggly, wiggly fellow.

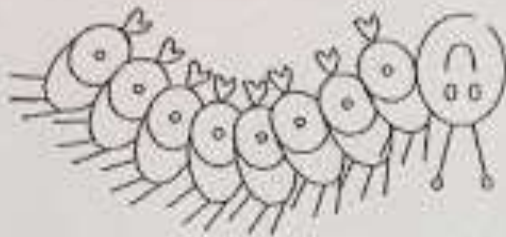


Only My Opinion

He spins himself a blanket and soon falls fast asleep.

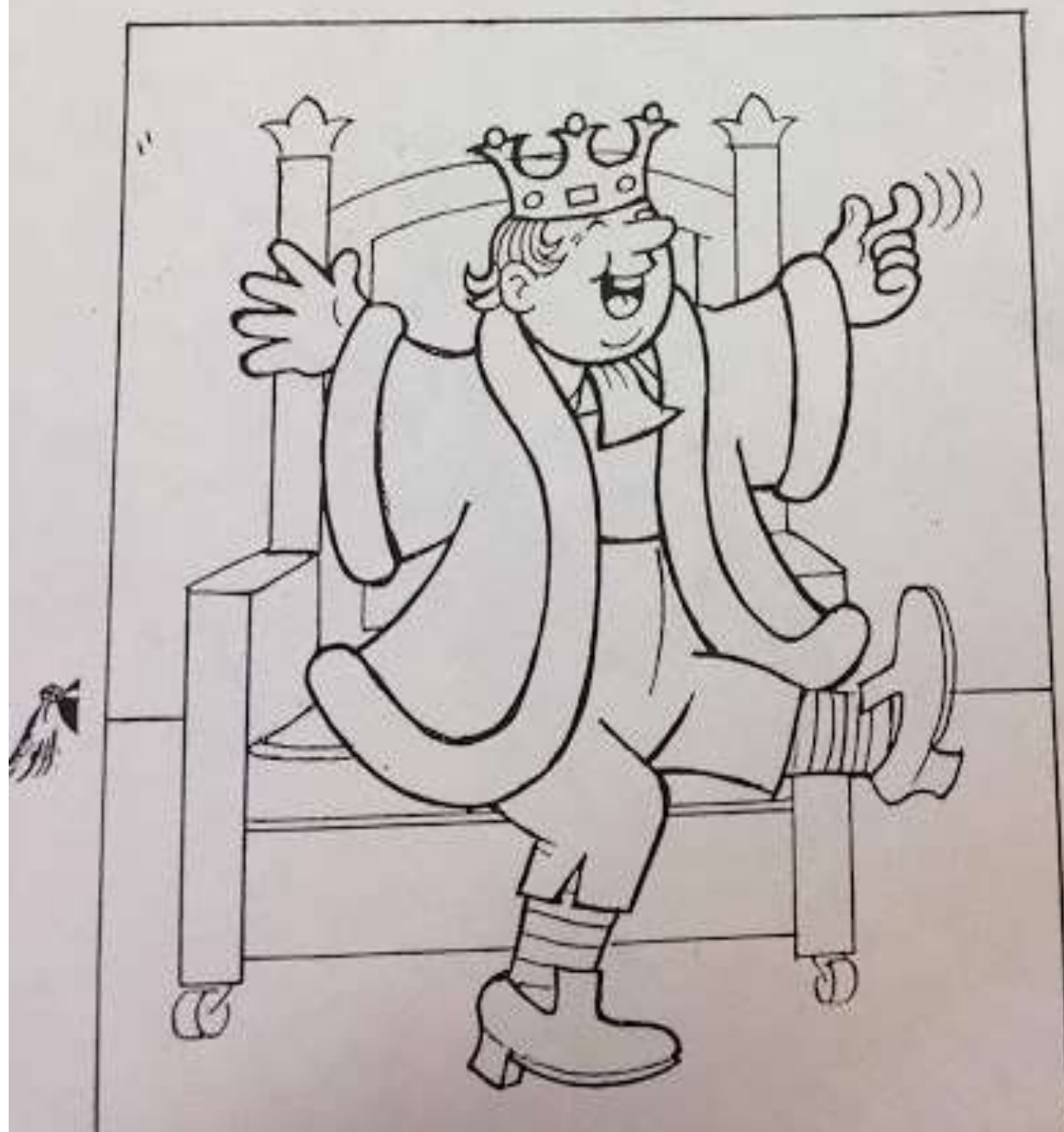

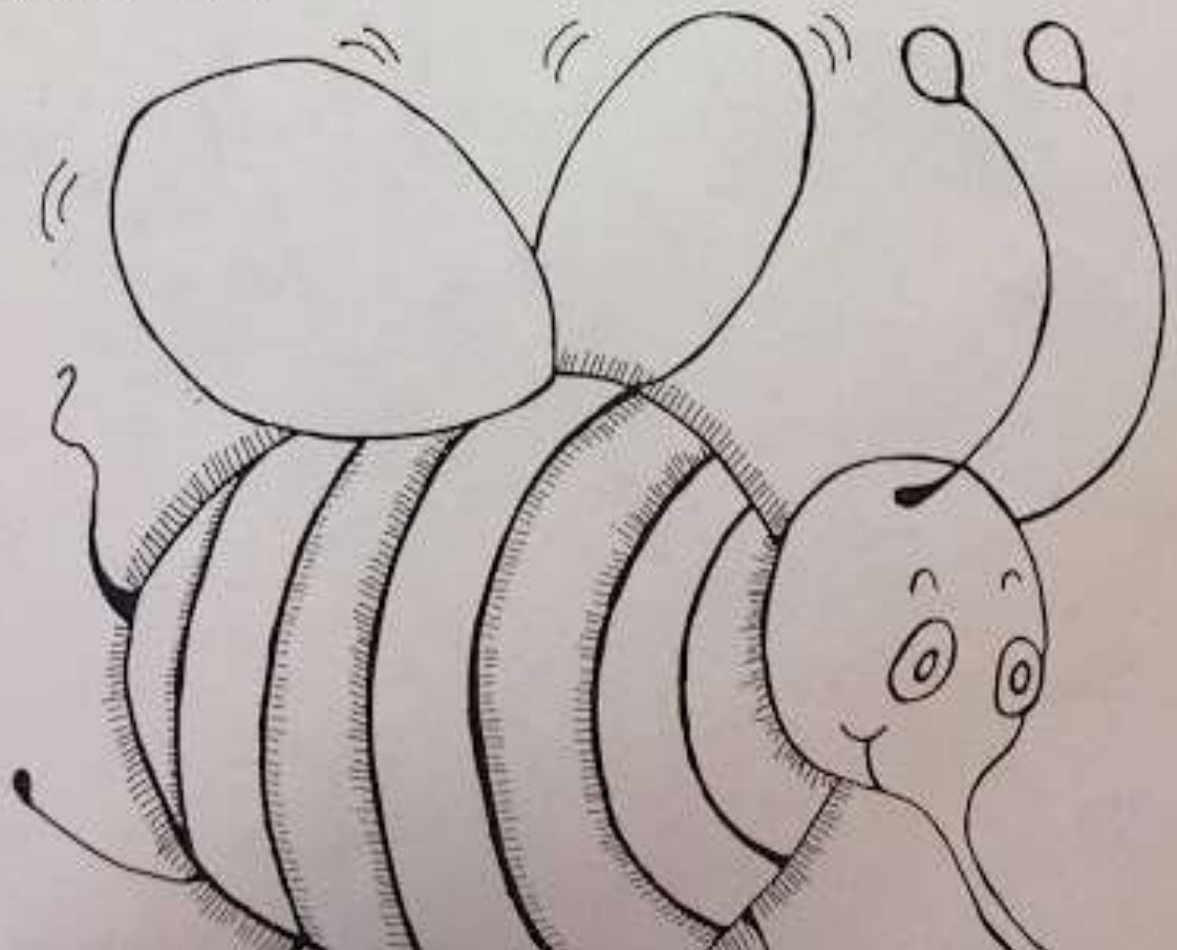

And he called for his fiddlers three.




The Busy Bee.

Tom, Tom, The Piper's Son.

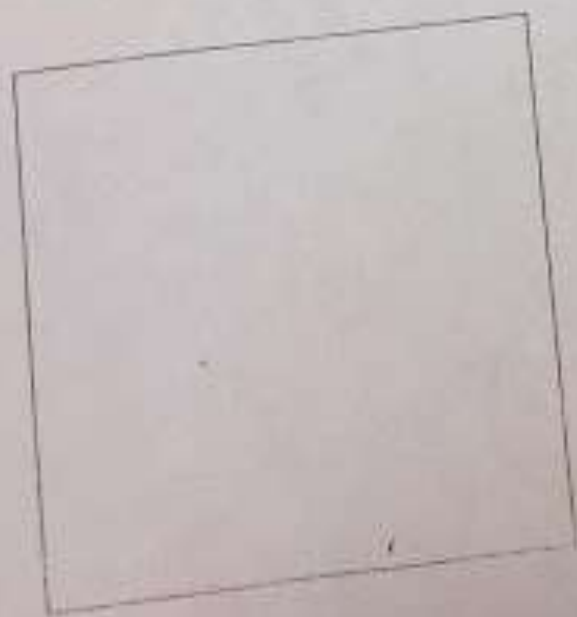
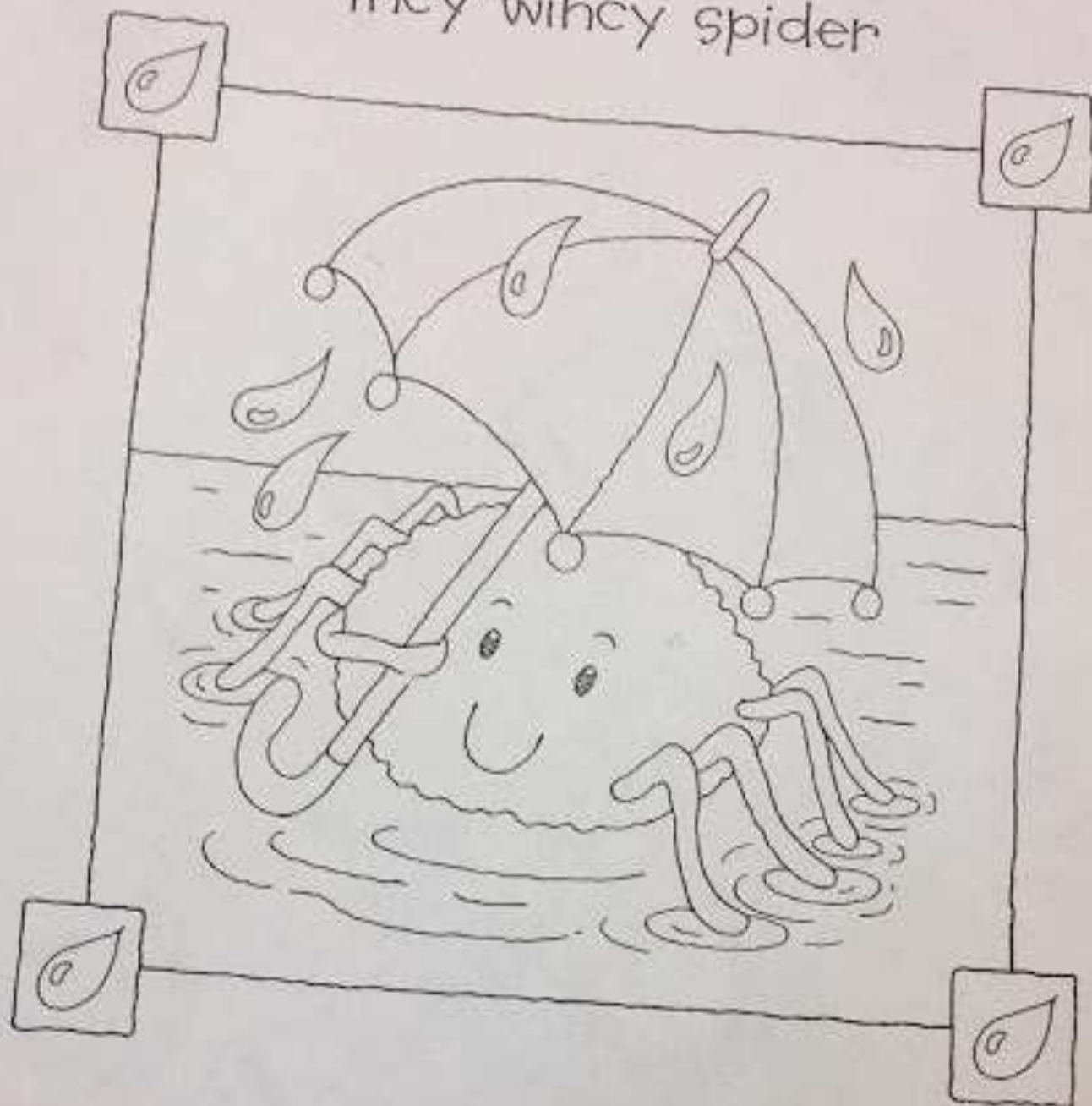
Tom, Tom, the piper's son,

And Tom went howling down the street.



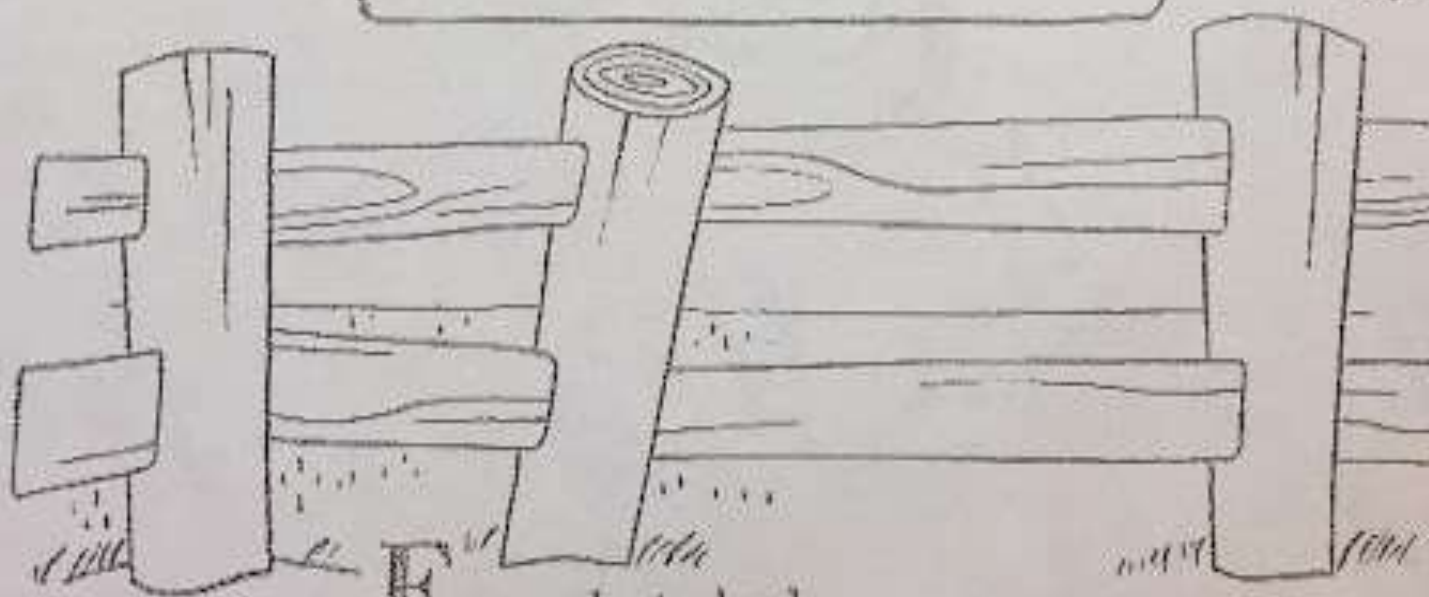


Wee Willie Winkie

Higgledy, Piggledy, my black hen.

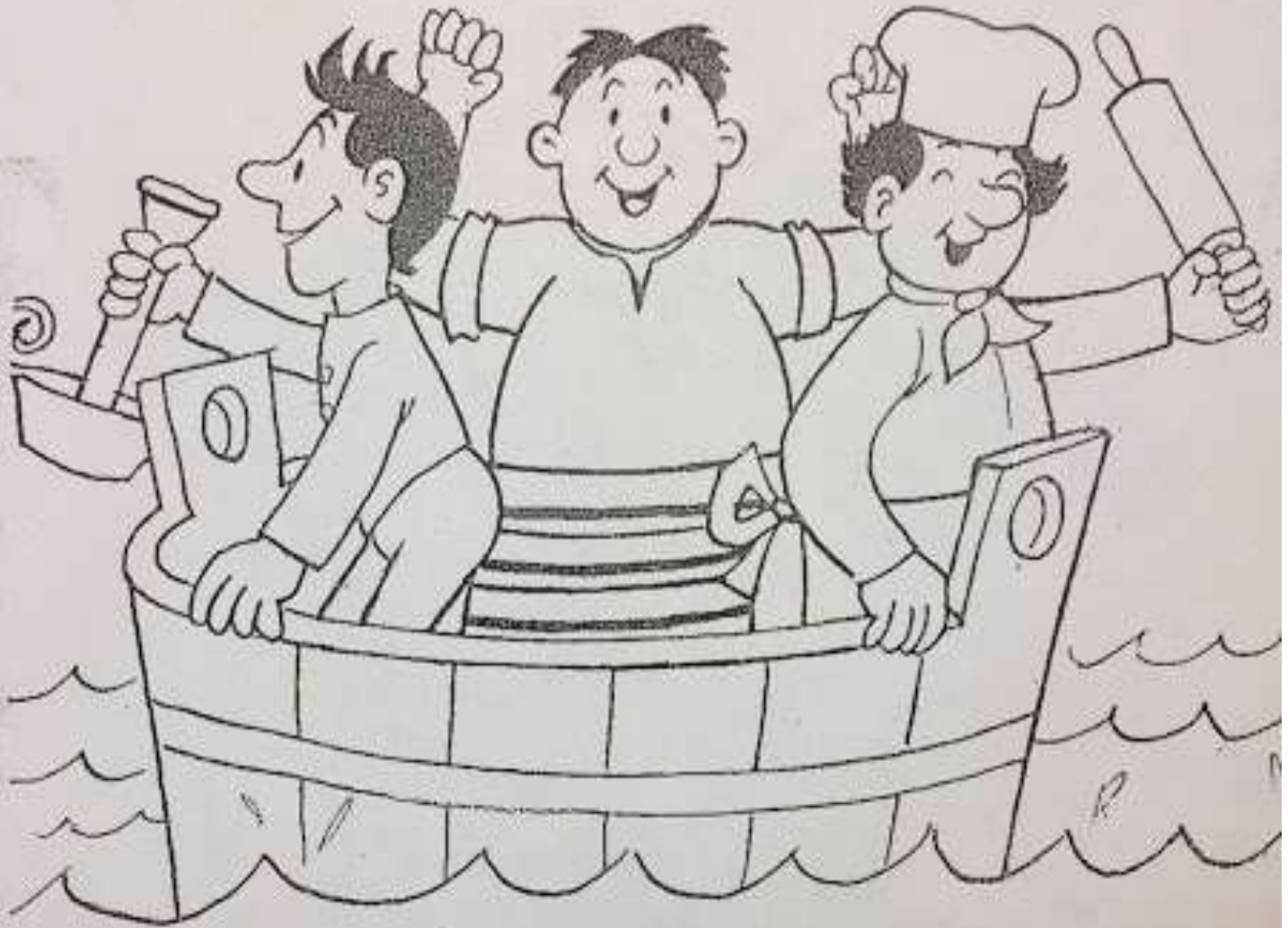
Jolly red nose

Crawling on the floor.

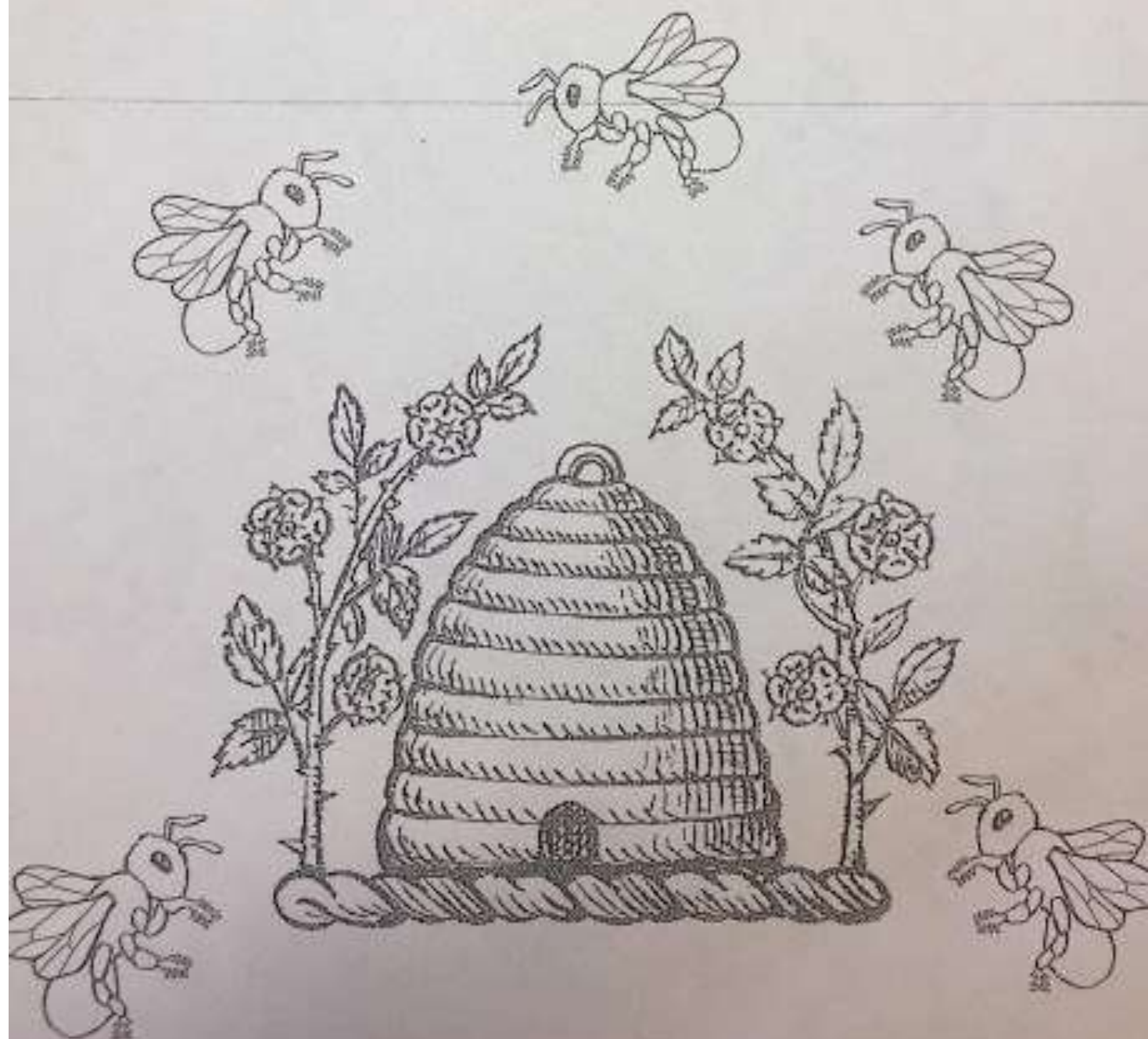
Four little babies

Until I say . . . PEEK!

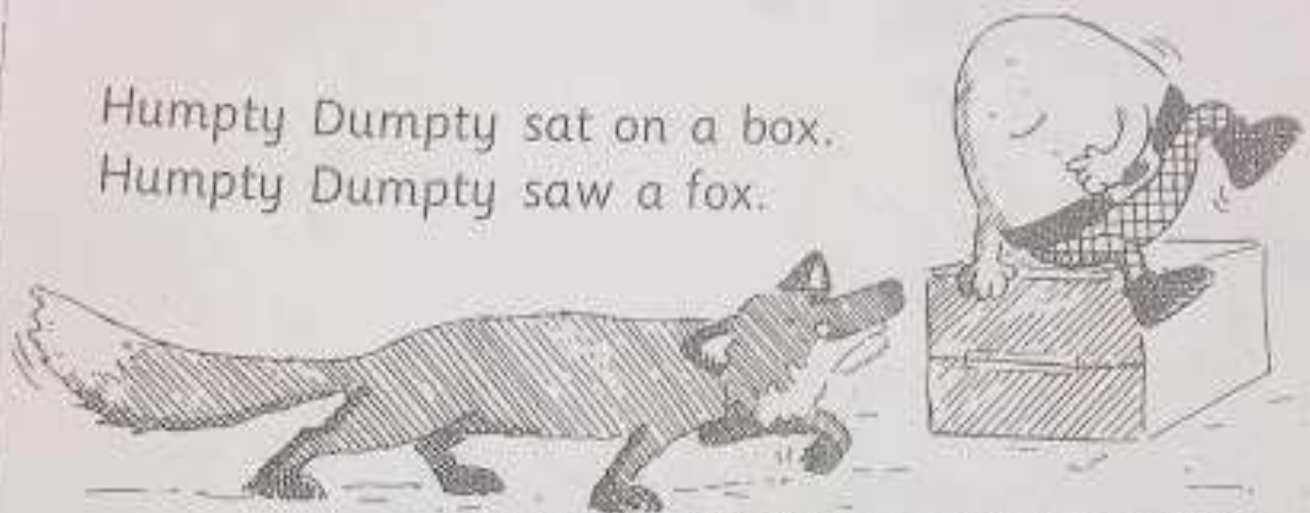


Here is the bee hive

1...2...3...4...5...BUZZ!

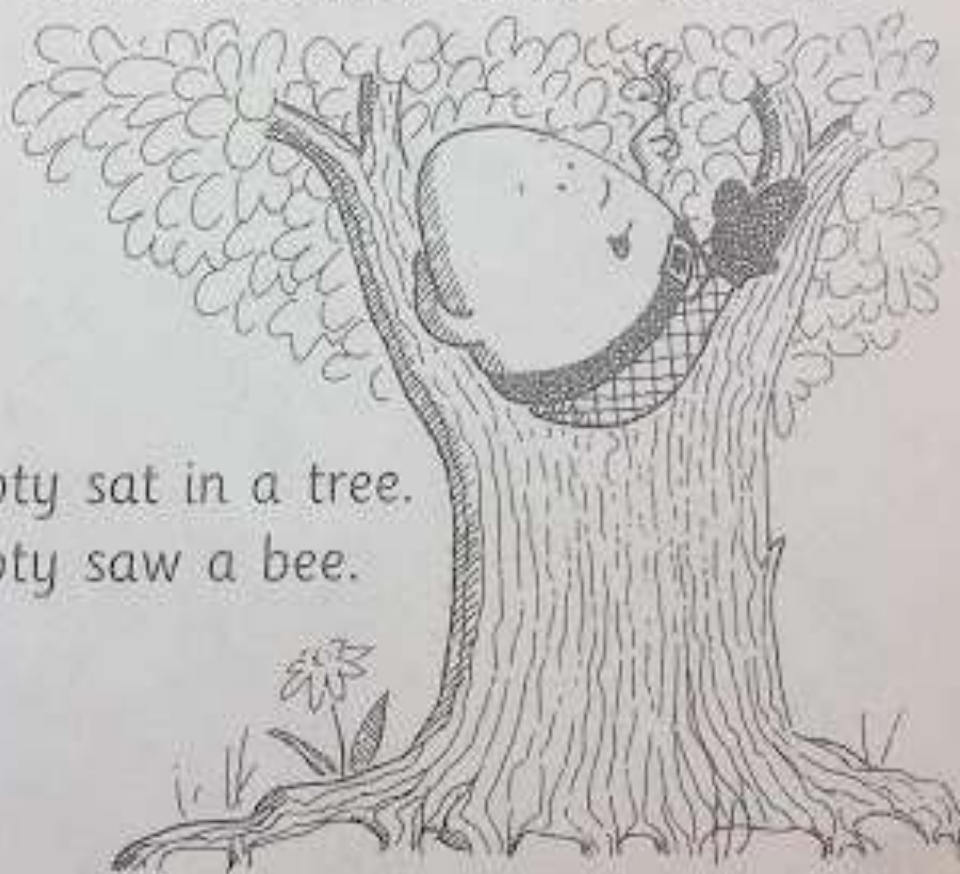


MORE HUMPTY DUMPTIES
