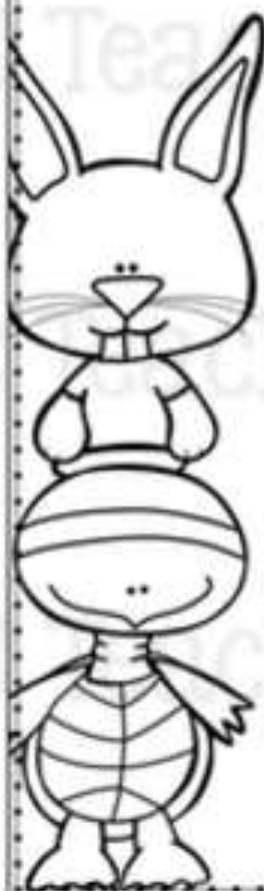

In school we use an interactive programme called Bua Na Cainte 1. The children interact with the conversations, songs, stories and play various games. This is available for you to download for free on a computer/laptop.

1. Go to www.edco.ie/bua

2. Select the file which suits your computer either computer or Mac.

3. Select the class level you require, First Class which is Bua na Cainte 1 and click on it to start a download of the file.

4. Once the download has completed, click on the file to install and follow the on-screen instructions.

5. A Bua na Cainte icon will appear on your desktop. Once you select this icon a login page will open where you will need to enter the details included below. The login details can be used for all class versions.

6. Username: trial

Password: trial.
